Muaythai BC sanctioned it's first event – Muaythai Gladiators in September 2022 Amateur rankings introduced in October 2022. Introduction of Interclubs – starting to prepare amateur athletes for competitions. By end of 2022, we had members in 7 gaming zones. 				
	 2023 Focus 1st EVER Provincial Championships happening in September 2023. 1st AGM as a PSO in May 2nd gym to host Interclubs – Heart & Soul Muaythai introduced "The Smoke Show" – first event was in January with 2 more planned before end of year. 3.0	Robin Finley - President of MT Canada :				
	 Competition Pathway through our PSO (Provincials, Nationals, Worlds). These opportunities are available thanks to the alignment of MTBC and MTC. 				



- Muaythai Canada (MTC) The National sports organization under our parent organization, International Federation for Muaythai Amateurs (IFMA). MTC has been trying to get recognition under the Olympics, which came last year. Near future will likely show up as a demonstration. Medal competitions few years away.
- Proud of MTBC for getting up and running as a PSO. Challenge for organizations with too few people doing the work and too few athletes. Keep promoting the sport, particularly for youth. Looking to grow sport in Canada.
- Keep producing great athletes, instructors, gyms and promotions and continue to get people interested and involved in the sport
- Olympics Monumental to have Muaythai accepted into the Olympics.
- Current team at the world's 6 athletes attending, including 1 from BC.
 - Counts substantially different in the tournaments than for an individual fight. A lot more safety driven.
 - o Takes time to go in and win.
 - Want to fill the under 23 division as much a possible, while recognizing that athletes may not be ready for that level
- Well done MTBC. You have come very far very fast. You have done the right things. Be patient and understanding and we will get there together.

- Sport Liability Coverage (\$2M Limit)
 - Protects Muaythai BC and member clubs in the event that someone sues in a civil action for bodily injury or property damage of others
 - Includes participant liability

Sport Accident Coverage

- Injured member (not volunteers) can recoup out-of-pocket expenses due to injury without having to prove negligence
- Coverage for sanctioned activities including competitions, demonstrations and training (within Canada only)
- In addition to provincial coverage and any private coverage that you may have in place.

officials for events that require Muaythai BC Officials. Ongoing



	 Muaythai BC has come up with 3 levels to our officiating protocols: Level 1 - This level introduces you to score keeping, time keeping and judging. Level 2 - This training is referee specific. Learning all the roles of this very important role. Level 3 - This level showcases how all positions comes together to work as a team - putting it all into perspective. All 3 levels must be completed to officiate any Muaythai BC event. Need to understand all of the roles. Training is primarily theory. On hand training comes from volunteering your time to help out at interclubs and sparring sessions.
